Built in 1848, the church organ originally came from Leeds Parish Church, where it was said to be used as a practice organ for the choir. Undertaken by J.M. Spink Ltd. of Leeds the work should guarantee original pipe organ music at St Paul's for a further 100 vears.

Director of Music, Matthew Atherton, played with both passion and command. The event raised approximately £650 which will help to fund the church and their organ restoration costs.

Organiser Robert McKenzie Johnston said: "The boys sang beautifully, displaying cheerful commitment and energy throughout. Rufus Hornyold-Strickland impressed the audience with his trumpet playing."
